Use a crow repellent net.


Kitchen waste

Rubber items




Shoes

Incineration




Please cut twigs and branches to less than 40 cm in length and tie with string. Up to 5cm thick.




Waste paper / Smelly Paper




Disposable heating pad




Pillows, cushions and carpets (< 40 cm)

Leather goods (Metal parts → can, metals)

Four types of baskets are used. Paper (other than shredder waste) is tied with string. Remove cloths and shredded waste in separate bags.

Use a gas removal cap, or if not available, spray it on a newspaper, etc.</p> <p>Put items in the yellow basket. Put them straight in; do not put them in a bag first</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Recycling</p> | <p>~ Please refrain from putting out garbage if it is raining ~</p> <p>E.g.) Please tie these up with free paper twine distributed by the city.</p> <p>Newspapers, flyers Cardboard</p> <p>Magazines, books, notebooks, dictionaries (Bound publication) Tie with a string</p> <p>Paper cartons Tie with a string</p> <p>Open these cut, rinse with water and dry before putting out.</p> <p>A paper pack that has silver paper stuck on the inside. → Burnable garbage</p> <p>Shredded paper (Paper only)</p> <p>Make sure the garbage bag is properly sealed.</p> <p>Use a transparent or semi-transparent bag (paper bag also OK)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Recycling</p> | <p>Please lightly wash the inside before putting out.</p> <p>Reusable bottles</p> <p>Reusable after washing. (returnable)</p> <p>Item with this mark Item with this mark </p> <p>Beer bottles, 1-sho bottles (1.8 l), etc. Remove the cap.</p> <p>Put items in the red basket. Put them straight in; do not put them in a bag first</p> <p>Assorted bottles</p> <p>Non-returnable glass bottles. (one-way bottles) Blue basket (small)</p> <p>Remove the cap.</p> <p>Put items in the blue basket (small). Basics Points of put out the garbage

| <p>Basics of put out the garbage 1</p> <p>Empty plastic bottles, plastic containers and packaging, cans and bottles should be emptied and lightly rinsed or wiped to reduce contamination. (It will also prevent odors when stored at home)</p> | <p>Basics of put out the garbage 2</p> <p>Garbage and leftover food should be drained and placed inside a garbage bag so that crows with good vision Please put it in the garbage bag so that crows can't see it. (It is effective to wrap it with other burnable garbage)</p> | <p>Basics of put out the garbage 3</p> <p>Garbage is sorted by type and collected according to the region. Please put it out by 8:00 AM on each day of the week. This is called [sorted disposal]. Garbage that has not been sorted out will not be collected.</p> |
